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Baghouse Project Update

Moran Iron Works is near completion of the Unit 2 Baghouse project, which was started in early October of 2010. The fabrication and assembly within our shop has been completed with the positioning and welding of the lifting lugs. This month we are transporting the pieces, ranging between 7,000 pounds to over 127,000 pounds, down our high wire corridor to our deep water port. Due to the enormous size of the baghouse units, some fabrication is required once they reach the port. MIW welders will be on site at the deep water port to complete pre-barging fabrication and assist in barge loading each piece.

Each module is placed on the barge with specific purpose, and our project managers spend a significant amount of time establishing the precise module placement which will decrease handling time and when unloaded, it will increase production and safety.

As usual, MIW staff will be on the job site to witness the unloading when the barges reach their destination.

After the completion of Unit 2, our shop floors will be filling with materials for the fabrication and assembly of Unit 3. The Unit 3 baghouse project is somewhat larger than the Unit 2 project and fabrication is scheduled to start this summer.
