Barging Fabrications on the Great Lakes

MIW has been fortunate to have access to Michigan's natural resources by means of a deep water port located in Rogers City, Michigan. The ability to modularize pieces in a more finished condition saves customers money and dramatically cuts time assembling and installing at the jobsite.

MIW has utilized barging resources since 2005 with multiple trusted companies throughout the United States. Since then we have gained useful information from our experiences, for instance the ideal time of year for us to employ the barging method is from May 1st thru September 30th. We have found it is best to avoid the melting lake ice in early spring and then the build up of icing on cargo in the late fall. At the start of a new large fabrication project, these calendar dates are taken into consideration when scheduling with a customer.

The ability to handle many different types of over dimensional and non-reducible loads is what sets Moran Iron Works, Inc. apart from the average fabricator.

New Addition— Construction Update

The new modern addition to Moran Iron Works is well underway. Ending Phase One was the positioning of four of the six large overhead cranes above the work bays.

The second phase of construction will begin with the assembly of the insulation, roofing and sidewalls, and then moving on to the completion of the floors and utilities.

Each step forward is exciting to see as we move closer to our September completion goal.
